# Climate Change – Impact



UK

- **All 10** of the warmest years on record have occurred since 2000.
- Heatwaves expected **every other year** by 2050.
- **10,000 heat-related deaths** expected without adaption to building design.



Brazil

- In 2024, Brazil suffered forest fires that consumed **30.86 million hectares** — an area larger than Italy.
- Brazil has seen a **460% increase** in climate-related disasters since the 1990s.
- In parts of Brazil, maximum temperatures have increased by up to **3°C** over the last ~60 years, exceeding global average warming..



Netherlands

- The Netherlands is ranked **5th in the world** in climate performance (CCPI 2025) thanks to strong renewable energy and emissions policies.
- But the Netherlands expects wetter winters and drier summers leading to **drought/groundwater fluctuation**.
- **425,000 buildings** with short remaining technical life due to this fluctuation



Italy

- In 2021–2022, Italy recorded Europe's highest recorded temperature: **48.8 °C** in Sicily.
- In 2022, during the European heatwaves, Italy had an estimated **18,010 excess deaths** due to heat.
- By 2050, climate change could eat up over **5% of Italy's GDP** in damage costs if nothing is done.
